



Hope in Leaders

THANKS TO YOUR SUPPORT, INCREASING NUMBERS OF SEMINARIANS ARE ABLE TO SERVE THEIR DIOCESES.

There is good news for the future of the Church in our country's mission dioceses. Increasing numbers of young men are answering God's call and pursuing vocations to the priesthood. While these seminarians are a gift for their brothers and sisters in Christ, the cost of their education creates significant financial challenges for the dioceses that must support them. In 2011, your gifts helped educate 595 seminarians, ensuring that there were no financial barriers preventing them from serving the Church in places that need it most.

In addition to this generous support, Catholic Extension has launched a new initiative that maximizes your gift and lessens the cost of seminarian education for mission dioceses. Through this initiative, the participating seminary, the mission diocese, and you, our generous donors, share the cost of scholarships that will help seminarians pursue advanced theological degrees.

Ryan Rojo is one such seminarian to benefit from this initiative, and is currently enrolled at the University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary. Upon ordination, he will return to serve the Diocese of San Angelo, Texas, which currently has one priest for every 2,000 Catholics. "I think a lot of times we do things, and we never see the fruits of our labor," said Rojo. "I just want to encourage donors out there to look at me and say, 'This is the fruit.' I am the fruit of their labor."

Hope in Outreach

THANKS TO YOUR SUPPORT. A MINISTRY CONTINUES EXTENDING A HAND TO A STRUGGLING COMMUNITY.

Our Lady Help of Christians Center (OLHC) was established in 2008 to provide outreach to the 2,700 people suffering from poverty and unemployment in and around Gwinn, Michigan. With the help of parishioners from Saint Anthony Parish and several Sisters of St. Paul of Chartres, the ministry offered food and social services, but could not further expand its reach. "We sat in meetings wondering where next month's money and budget would come from," said the Center's Spiritual Director, Deacon Jack Leadbetter.

Last year, Catholic Extension donors supported Our Lady Help of Christians with \$50,000. Your gifts have helped the Center cover basic operational expenses so that volunteers can focus on their mission to serve the community's spiritual needs. In addition to providing basic social services, they are now personally inviting people to Bible studies, CCD classes and religious celebrations. "All the parishioners are involved," said Deacon Leadbetter. "We're getting Catholics excited about their faith again."

The infusion of faith is helping the community renew their sense of self worth—something that Deacon Leadbetter believes will help them rise above their struggles. And without the support of Catholic Extension donors, it would not have been possible. "The grant has given us purpose," he said, "I think we're going to have a great impact."

THANKS TO YOUR SUPPORT, A GROWING PARISH COMMUNITY IN DEER PARK, WASHINGTON, HAS A **NEW HOME.**

In 2004, parishioners of St. Mary Presentation Parish began a campaign to raise money for a new church and parish facilities—a plan that was decades in the making. Their church, originally built with the help of Catholic Extension funding, could no longer accommodate the growing Catholic community or its ministries. On Sundays, religious education classes were held in a nearby garage. "We were stretched to the limit," said George Bacon, a parishioner for eight years.

Responding to their need, Catholic Extension donors brought St. Mary's fundraising efforts to completion with a generous gift: the final \$50,000 needed to break ground on a new church. The impact was instant. "People were cheering and crying and just shocked that anybody would think of little old St. Mary's," explained parishioner Donna Gyllenhammer.

Your investment in "little old St. Mary's" was an answer to a prayer for parishioners who had saved diligently for so many years. Your gifts are a wonderful demonstration that we, as Catholics, are all united in faith no matter where God plants us. Said Father Al Grashar, Pastor: "The importance of this for us was to see, as parishioners, that there are others that are interested in helping us to build our dreams, to build our new church."


LEAVING A LEGACY



TOTAL REVENUE & SUPPORT = \$25.1 MILLION





Hope for the Future

In addition to our traditional areas of support, Catholic Extension last year launched a series of Strategic Initiatives designed to proactively address many of the shared challenges facing America's mission dioceses. These initiatives give mission dioceses access to programs that are beyond their financial reach.

By partnering with you, with leading Catholic organizations, and with the mission dioceses, we are creating a true collaboration between Catholics in our country that will propel the Church into a vibrant, sustainable future. Read on to discover how some of these initiatives are already inspiring hope across the United States.

Fostering Long-Term Growth — Mission Diocese Fund, LLC

In 2011, Catholic Extension formed the Mission Diocese Fund, LLC, a pooled-investment fund designed to provide mission dioceses with access to world-class fund managers that are typically unavailable to small endowments. Its benefits are twofold: 1) Diocesan assets are invested professionally to seek competitive returns with reduced risk, and 2) Diocesan staff can focus more time on fundraising and stewardship.

With increased endowments and ample returns, dioceses participating in the Fund can build up their financial resources and work toward fruitful, self-sustaining futures.



Developing Young Leaders — Campus Ministry Leadership


In 2011, Catholic Extension partnered with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Office of Education to make its annual Campus Ministry Leadership Institute (CMLI) more accessible for campus ministers across the country. Through this partnership, Extension offered scholarships to campus ministers from mission dioceses who otherwise would not have been able to attend.

The campus ministry team at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs was one of the first to benefit. While at CMLI, these young leaders created a plan for increasing the Catholic presence at their university and reaching out to other Catholic students. They are experiencing great success and igniting faith at their university.

Advancing Church Leaders — Parish Faith Renewal

In 2011, Catholic Extension joined forces with RENEW International to help offer religious education and evangelization programs to mission dioceses.

Thanks to your gifts, more than 3,000 Catholics in the Diocese of Amarillo, Texas, are renewing their faith through the study of Catholic Church teachings. This renewal is deepening the experience of excellent Church life for all its parishioners, and modeling faith for future generations of Catholics.
