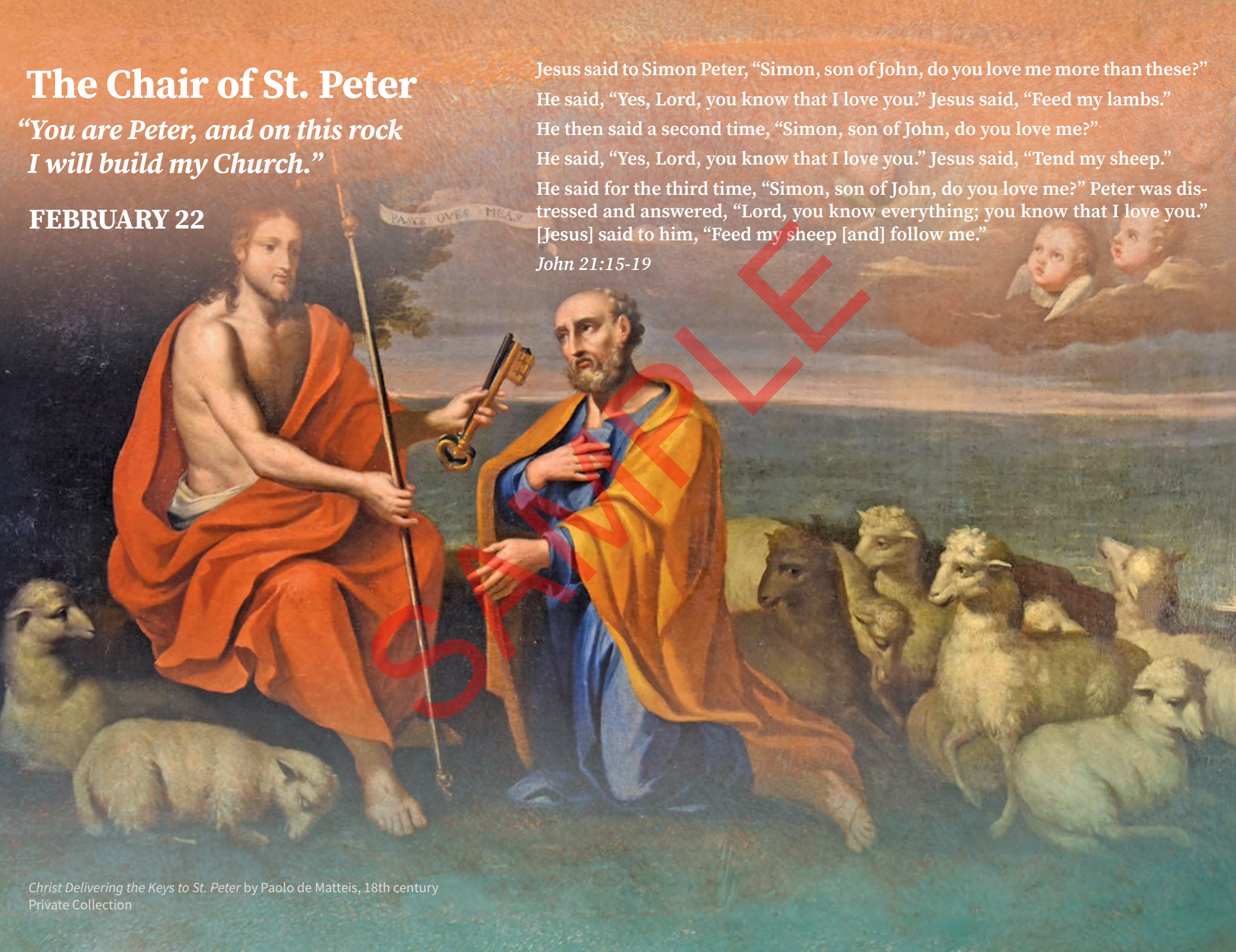

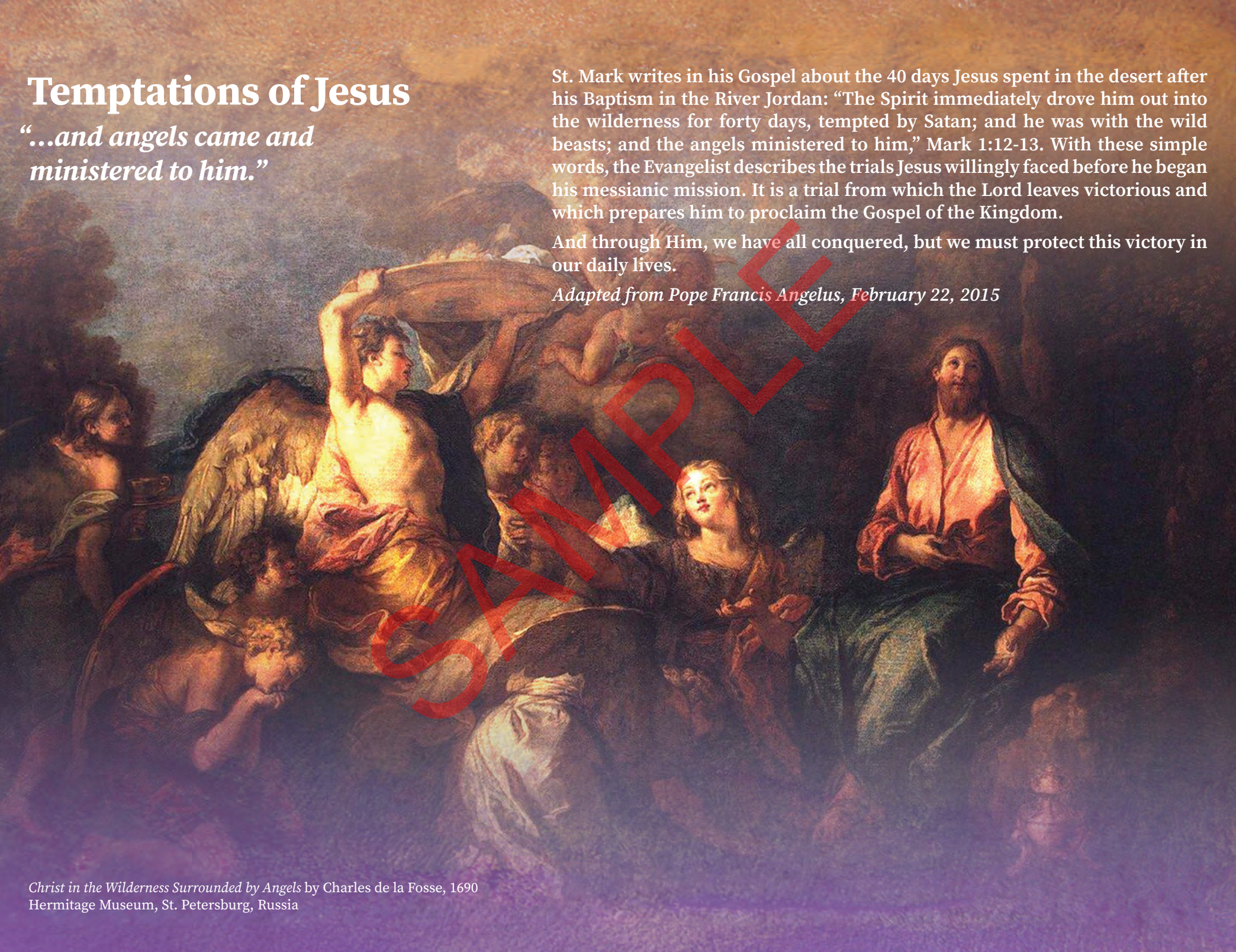
Temptations of Jesus

“...and angels came and ministered to him.”

St. Mark writes in his Gospel about the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert after his Baptism in the River Jordan: “The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered to him,” Mark 1:12-13. With these simple words, the Evangelist describes the trials Jesus willingly faced before he began his messianic mission. It is a trial from which the Lord leaves victorious and which prepares him to proclaim the Gospel of the Kingdom.

And through Him, we have all conquered, but we must protect this victory in our daily lives.

The Millennial generation has a saint

MAY 3, 1991 – OCTOBER 12, 2006

Carlo was a joyful and friendly 15-year-old Italian who died of leukemia. His spirituality was rooted in his daily encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist and his devotion to Mary.

When he was 11, he united his love for the Eucharist and computers by creating a webpage that traced Eucharistic miracles that have occurred throughout history. From St. Francis and St. Anthony of Padua, he learned to respect creation and to dedicate himself to the poorest, the homeless, and non-European Union citizens, whom he supported with donations from his weekly pocket money.

In October 2016, Carlo fell ill. A few days before his hospitalization, he offered his life to the Lord for the Pope and the Church.

The main legacy that Carlo left for the new generations is the consistency of life with the values of the Gospel. Carlo can be defined as a true apostle in all the environments in which he lived a typical adolescent life: family, school, sports, travel and games.

Blessed Stanly Rother

*The Oklahoma priest is the first
U.S.-born priest to be beatified.*

MARCH 27, 1935 – JULY 28, 1981

Blessed Stanley Rother was born in Okarche, Oklahoma. He grew up on a farm, attended Holy Trinity Catholic Church and School, and enjoyed a typical small-town childhood filled with chores, sports, and altar serving. During high school, he began to consider a vocation to the priesthood. He was ordained on May 25, 1963.

He felt a strong calling to serve in Santiago Atitlán, Guatemala. There, he immersed himself in the Tz'utujil culture, learning their language and ministering to the impoverished community. Tragically, on July 28, 1981, he was murdered for his commitment to the people he loved. In 2016, he was recognized as a martyr, becoming the first U.S.-born priest to be beatified. The Archdiocese of Oklahoma City has built a shrine in his honor.

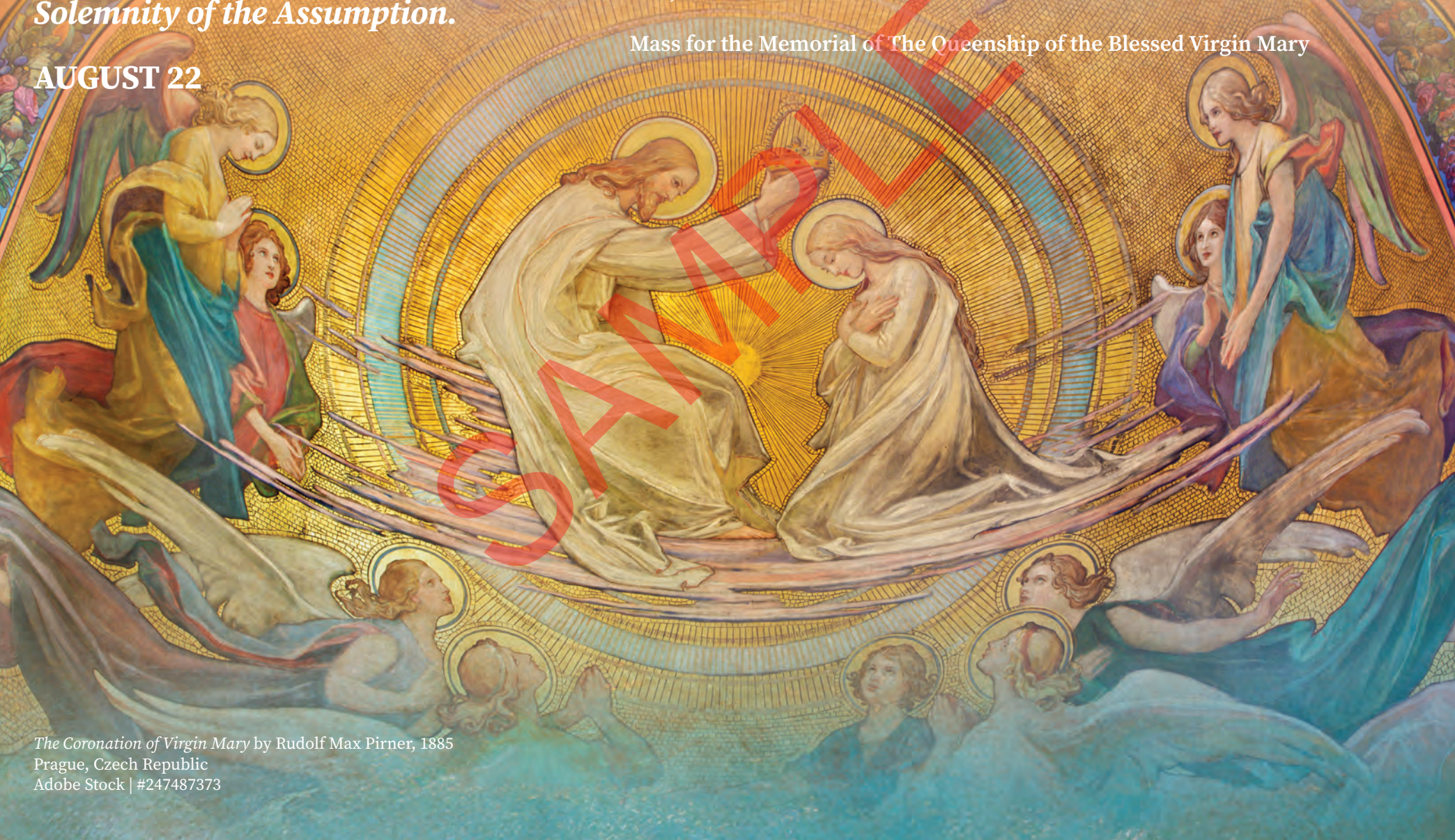

Born in southern Turkey in the third century. His family raised him as a Christian, but he was orphaned at a young age. Remembering the rich young man in the Gospel, St. Nicholas used his inheritance to assist the needy, the sick, and the poor.

One of the stories about him involves a man with three daughters of marriageable age. The family was poor, and their father could not afford a suitable dowry. One night, Nicholas went to the family's home, threw a bag of coins through the open window, then fled before he could be identified. With the money, the father was able to marry his daughter. Nicholas returned twice more at night. But the third time, the father rushed out to identify his benefactor. Nicholas begged him not to tell anyone what he had done.

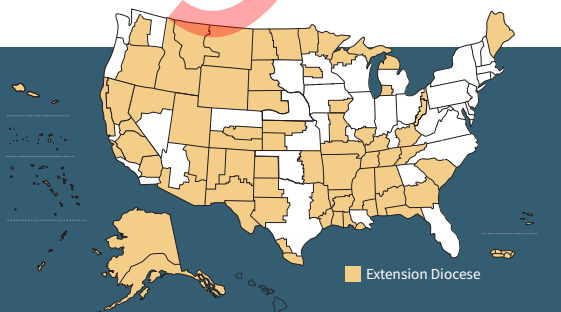

ABSTINENCE

Abstinence is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Pastors and parents are encouraged to see that children who are not bound by the obligation to fast and abstain are led to appreciate an authentic sense of penance.

FAST & ABSTINENCE

In addition to abstinence, fasting is to be observed by all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 years (inclusive). On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. Note: Those who are unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.
